### What is CACOR?

The Canadian Association for the Club of Rome (CACOR) is a dynamic and informative association whose members discuss pertinent global topics with some of the most informed eminent and articulate specialists. Its mission is to foster widespread understanding of the relationship between human activities and the environment needed for the long term preservation of human civilization.

### Our History

In April of 1968, Aurelio Peccei, an Italian industrialist, along with Alexander King, a British scientist, and some 30 other scientists, educators, industrialists, and international civil servants, gathered in Rome to share their concerns about global problems which they named the "Global Problématique" - the predicament of humankind. Out of this meeting they founded the CLUB of ROME (CoR)

CACOR was established in 1974 and was one of the first of over twenty National Associations in the world whose members have interests in common with the CLUB of ROME.

### We hope to:

- promote among Canadians the study and discussion of world problems
- develop new policies, attitudes and courses of action
- stimulate study and research into global interdependence
- determine the impact of global solutions on Canada,
- and identify an appropriate role for Canada as a global facilitator

### How do we achieve this?

- by encouraging members to adopt a global, holistic and long-term perspective on issues of global importance

- by interacting with other organizations to discuss problems of global importance.
- by developing outreach projects to increase awareness and participation in solutions to global problems.
- by soliciting, receiving and accepting subscriptions, gifts, legacies, bequests, grants and other contributions to implement the above.

### Governance

CACOR is an independent association. It has an elected board of members that meets monthly. Subcommittees allow members to participate and contribute actively in the organization.

Although most activities currently take place in the national capital region, CACOR has members throughout Canada.
