#### Albertans are Not Asked to Be Owners and Citizens

- 1. 1976 Premier Lougheed created the Heritage Trust Fund: "to save for the future, to strengthen or diversify the economy, and to improve the quality of life of Albertans." 30% of royalties into the fund.
- 2. 1982 Premier Lougheed cut the royalties going into the fund to 15%.
- 3. 1987 Premier Getty cut the royalties going into the fund to 0%.
- 4. Albertans accept all of these moves as a good deal. No discussion of treating cash from the sale of assets as if it were earned income.
- 5. Premier Klein never addressed Albertans as "citizens." Only as "stakeholders" and "shareholders."
- 6. Having the lowest taxes in Canada becomes part of the identity of the majority of Albertans.



#### Predominant Public Flavour of (many) Alberta's Elites

- 1. Committed to/organized for/identified with success as an MTI culture/society/economy. Free range capitalism. "TINA."





# **Observations**



#### A Word of Caution

I am going to offer a reading of our situation that is not yet well understood, even by me.

I am still teaching myself to see the mess of complex living messes we are in with as fresh an imagination and as humble and generous a heart as I can muster.

I share it here with you in the hope that you may recognize the general direction in which I am pointing as a direction worth pursuing.

I fear for our future because as Modern Techno-Industrial (MTI) cultures we are seeing and responding to our situation as you would expect MTI persons in MTI organizations and societies to do.

The insight that we are culture trapped; that we are reaching the end of the MTI road has not yet sunk in deeply enough for us to invest ourselves in the new work of outgrowing our own MTI formation and living into a truly new future.

#### 1. The UCP are Not as Advertised

The UCP are NOT a normal conservative government or movement.

Rather, they are better understood as an alt-right, elite led and funded group who have longed for Alberta to become a permanent bastion in Canada for neoclassical economics and personal freedom.

The watchword is "ordered freedom."



# 2. The UCP is Hardening Hearts/Coarsening Minds

It is in the interest of the elites in and behind the UCP to stir up fear and resentment in folks who are hard pressed by today's conditions and troubles when they look to a future which no longer appears to be promising.

This is relatively easy to do in a world in which is equipped with the web and social media and in which every voice can be magnified.

The inability of established institutions to make reliable sense of what is going on, much less to respond appropriately to it on time and on budget, makes it easier for hard-pressed folks to abandon what has been the dominant story of our time.

Expect psychological, and even physical, violence to increase. As of today, we have no sound idea of how much further down we can sink as a MTI liberal democratic society. We simply do not know where the bottom is.

- Everyone knows that "Albertans are alienated from Canada."
- The press take this for granted and reinforce it.
- Jason Kenney led the "We need a Fair Deal" chorus and he was elected.
- Consider the Fair Deal hearings and the Report.
- Consider that the referendum on removing equalization passed in 2021.
- The UCP was re-elected, even with its Sovereignty Act.

# 5. Have Some Empathy for Those Who are Stirred Up

Understandably, those who are being stirred up and egged on are hungry to make sense of what has happened to them and why. Where did their world go? Who took it from them? How did this happen?

The comforting UCP story appears to answer these questions; to make sense out of the noise and confusion.

This is worth a lot to them.

Do not despise them for their hunger. We in the increasingly cosmopolitan MTI liberal democratic world have allowed them to be ignored and laughed at.

We have not offered them a better story.






# Danielle Smith is indifferent to the climate crisis. She's selling an alternate reality to Albertans


