### The Publication of 'The Great Disruption.'

Our speaker today is TD Dougherty, a retired environmental scientist. He has been a CACOR member for well over a decade and is one of the administrators of this Zoom presentation series.

DESCRIPTION: Today, he explains how he came to publish a series of climate fiction (cli-fi) books. These books outline the lives of various characters in the not-too-distant future. Climate change has exceeded expectations and keeps getting more intense. Thus far, *The Odd One* has followed Max (a scientist), *The Rich One* followed Doug (an entrepreneur), and *The Young One* followed Hamilton (a young boy who ages into a man in an emerging wilderness). More books are planned in the coming years. None is for the faint of heart. Rather, the stories are explorations of the sorts of realities people may face as the grand uncontrolled experiment we are undertaking on our atmosphere and hydrosphere unfolds.

The presentation will be followed by a conversation, questions, & observations from the participants.



## Basis in Plausibility


There are scientific bases to believe many things possible

 Kidney stones, murder, disease, poisoning, attack, imprisonment, hunger, thirst, homelessness




### The Odd One

Max is a scientist who works in a laboratory

Throughout the story he loses family members to tragedies

Max encounters a young boy in the ruins of his town—we encounter him again in *The Young One* 

Max encounters a man is dress shoes pushing a wheel-barrow full of money through his town trying to buy food—we encounter him again in *The Rich One* 




### The Rich One

We follow Doug through his life from his time as a young boy through to his death from heat stroke as a middle-aged adult

He gradually learns from experience

He rises by his greed—opportunism, duplicity, cunning, and ruthlessness take to unimaginable heights

He eventually amasses enormous wealth, but in the end it does him little good as he falls victim to his greed and the ill-will of others



## The Young One


Hamilton goes from a city kid in Grade 3 to an experienced man of the wilderness

He becomes a climate refugee

He loses his family to disasters

He meets the loves of his life, but also loses them

He learns survival skills that include foraging, hunting, and battle

- A reminder of personal participation in the consumer economy




Subalpine forest in the Coast Mountains, British Columbia, Canada. TD Dougherty (2011)
