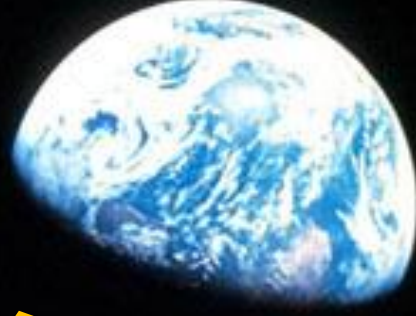

Our Process

1. We will watch a 17 minute “Frankly” of Nat Hagens with the questions in mind.
2. We will break into groups of 3.
 - Briefly introduce yourself to the others.
 - Choose a timekeeper to give a gentle nudge at the 15 minute mark.
 - Each one takes 2-3 minutes to offer their response to the 1st Question. No questions or discussion during this period.
 - After all have spoken, explore what you have heard and seen.
 - At the 15 minute mark shift to the 2nd Question.
 - Use the same process to *allow each person to speak*.
 - *Come back to the large group when asked.*
3. Offer highlights of your small group exploration to the whole group.

1. What did you hear from Nate about what he is learning that maps on to or challenges your own learning journey?
2. What did you hear from Nate that surprised you; that you didn't expect to hear and/or that disturbed or worried you?

A Follow Up Question

1. What did you hear from Nate about what he is learning that maps on to or challenges your own learning journey?
2. What did you hear from Nate that surprised you; that you didn't expect to hear and/or that disturbed or worried you?
3. Given what you have seen, heard and said, “What implications might there be for CACOR?”
